Blind Brook HS wins Regional Title in Statewide High School Mock Trial Tournament Sponsored by the New York State Bar Association.

Westchester County's Blind Brook HS is now the Lower Hudson Valley Champion after competing against high Schools in Dutchess, Putnam, Rockland, Orange and Ulster Counties in a statewide tournament that concludes later this month. To get to the Regional playoffs, each county fielded a team that won locally.

The Westchester finals pitted the plaintiffs of Blind Brook against the defending attorneys of Rye Neck as the 28<sup>th</sup> annual New York State High School Mock Trial Tournament finished in the Westchester County Courthouse in April. The two high school teams competed before Administrative Judge Alan Scheinkman, Supreme Court Justice Colleen Duffy and Westchester County Bar Association President Donald Sandford, all of whom decided the case—and the winning team.

It was a split decision. While the merits of the case went to the Rye Neck defense, Blind Brook was the Mock Trial winner, based on preparation, creativity and professionalism.

For the Regionals, Blind Brook had to switch roles and play the defense. They won that round as well.

The high school teams practiced their roles as lawyers and witnesses ever since they received their hypothetical case from the New York State Bar Association. "Pat Parker v Village of Empireville and its Board of Trustees" involves a unilateral decision by that fictitious village to ban previously allowed parking for high school students on public streets surrounding the school. Those who parked their cars there were given tickets. Pat Parker, whose car was ticketed, decided to fight the parking ban by filing suit in Supreme Court. He lost. The high school students had to learn rules of evidence, courtroom procedure, the difference between expert and opinion testimony and how to examine and cross examine witnesses. To get to the finals, each high school had to play both sides, switching from defense to plaintiff. The judges scored the performance of each team on a scale of 1 to 5 and rate the students' professionalism on a scale of 1-10.
